Medical Assistance Transportation Program (MATP)

If you receive Medical Assistance from the Department of Welfare, once submitted the client can call RRTA at: **(717) 291-1243** to request their bus tickets. RRTA will send the individual 10 bus tickets, these tickets should be used for ANY medical service including but not limited to: medical appointments (PCP/Optometrist/Dentist), prescription pick up (including Methadone dosing) & counseling services. When the individual is at these services, they can request a "doctor's note" aka receipt (proof) of service. The bus ticket & receipt should be submitted to RRTA and the individual will be reimbursed the amount of bus tickets they have "medical vouchers" for.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TRANSPORTATION APPLICATION

In addition to filling out the Medical Assistance Application, if you have a disability that prevents you from riding RRTA's regular bus routes and are under 65 it is recommended that you fill out the "ADA Application" in addition to the Medical Assistance application.

If you are 18 – 64 years of age it is recommended that you also fill out the PWD Application. If you are over 65 years of age, it is recommended that you also fill out the Senior Shared Ride Application.
